SCS/SNC Retirees, we begin our year with the President and CEO of Southern Nuclear, Steve Kuczynski, as the featured speaker. To accommodate his schedule, we will meet Monday, March 12, at *12noon* in room 130 Inverness Building 42, Note that this is not our customary meeting time. The Board will meet at 10:30.

Steve's visit is extremely timely. Southern has just received approval from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission by a 5-0 vote for a Combined Operating License to Vogtle Units 3 and 4. These will be the first nuclear units to receive permission for construction in over 30 years. The units are based on the standard Westinghouse AP-1000 plant, a new "passive" safety design that relies on gravity cooling rather than active pumps and valves. Steve's insight into the management of this \$14 billion first-of-a-kind program should be enlightening!

MEET THE SPEAKER

Lou has already mentioned in **Prez Sez** that our March program is being presented by Stephen Kuczynski, Chairman, President and CEO or Southern Nuclear. Kuczynski is new to the job, having been elected to these three offices just 9 months ago. However, he comes to the task with over 27 years experience in the operation and management of nuclear plants, including oversight of operational functions for all 6 of Exelon Nuclear's Illinois operating facilities.

Kucznyski holds a BSEE degree and is a licensed Senior Reactor Operator. He holds or has held several positions as a member of the National Nuclear Accrediting Board of the Institute of Nuclear Power Operations, including being involved with the Fukushima response team.

Call Hewitt 1-888-435-7563 - when they answer and after they ask for your ID key in *0# (star, zero, pound). Someone will answer

Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. ET Call HR Direct – 1-888-678-6787 and select Option 3. You will get a contact person who will transfer you to the right Hewitt benefit person.
